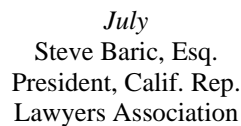

said they would give up voting for life in exchange for \$1 million dollars.

The poll of 20 percent of NYU undergraduates would exchange their vote for an Apple Touch iPod. About 66 percent of students polled by the school's journalism program said they'd sell their vote for a free ride to campus. However, half of the 3,000 students asked, said they would turn over their right to vote for life for \$1 million. Despite the results, 90 percent of those students willing to sell their vote view voting as "very important" or "somewhat important." The poll was conducted between Oct. 24 and Oct. 26 by NYU's "Foundations of Journalism" class.

## Fee for Service

Taxpayers in the United States pay for government services through local, regional and national collection systems. We have trash pickup and disposal, road, lighting, and sewer maintenance, plus limited education, health and safety services. Through our various tax collection systems, we also support a benefit system for individuals and families who are deemed "in need" but *temporarily* unable to carry the full financial burden for essential human services.

Fee-for-service is a basic principle upon which our way of life is supported. The only way one is entitled to an expectation of service is if one submits a fee or provides a skill in exchange for the service. This is a basic agreement between the supplier of the goods or services and the consumer.

When I need to broaden my education, I take on the responsibility of tuition. When I visit a doctor or hospital, or need an ambulance, I pay a portion of that service through my insurance minus my deductible. If I do not agree to pay my portion for which it is undeniably clear that I owe, then I am denied service.

In restaurants, the statement on each and every menu and in every waiting area is that the establish "retains the right to deny service."

My firm belief is that one does not get something for nothing; yet welfare recipients seem to avoid that expectation altogether. Their fee for medical service is their MediCal card – for which you and I pay. To purchase essential food items, their fee is Food Stamps – for which you and I pay.

## Political Forum—November 10, 2007

The monthly Forum preceded the November luncheon of Southern California Republican Women and Men. Led by Eldon Quick, incoming First Vice President, the discussion ranged over a number of topics, including the writers' strike, the recent fires, and the 2008 SCRW&M agenda.

Regarding the writers' strike, members who work in the film industry predicted an 8-week strike, a period after which studios can break contracts. The main complaint of the writers was also discussed, i.e., they want compensation for their work that is subsequently published on the Internet and on DVDs.

The recent California fires spurred discussion of whether building should be allowed in fire-prone areas. Is this a good idea if brush is cleared, or should the land be left in its natural condition? A few members questioned what would happen if there was no government bailout for those who lose their homes in disasters. General feeling was that people living in disaster-prone areas should be required to have adequate insurance, and that FEMA should not reimburse anyone who does not have insurance.

An intriguing question was then raised: what is the most important trait in a presidential candidate? Answers included:

- Integrity
- Leadership
- Sense of humor

Someone willing to face down Democrats and who will stand up for the Party in public forums.

Discussion then turned to the 2008 SCRW&M agenda. Most felt that the club should focus on the 2008 election, supporting deserving candidates, educating the public, disseminating information on the issues. It was also suggested that we get candidates or their representatives at each meeting. Other priorities include working on campaigns, sponsoring friends to come to SCRW&M meetings, increasing club membership and boosting the mailing list.

A related question was: what do members want to get out of the monthly SCRW&M meeting? There were a variety of responses, with most agreeing that discussion of issues and candidates was a great asset in understanding current political life. Many also felt that as a club we should be pressuring the RNC to put more money in California and to support GOP candidates. Some felt that we should not support the RNC until it supports California candidates. Also suggested was that members write their Congressmen, their local newspapers, and their favorite Internet blogs.

A question arose about giving out Eagle awards to \$100 members. These were formerly ceramic eagles; recently we have posted names at each meeting instead of giving out an actual award. Most members felt that recognition of their contribution in the Newsletter is thanks enough—that no further reward is wanted or expected.

The meeting concluded with a discussion of current issues in Pakistan, which appears on the verge of either increased military rule or chaos. It was noted that the U. S. is in a difficult position—instead of standing on our principles and disparaging dictatorship we have thrown in our lot with Pervez Musharraf. As a consequence, we need to get Pakistan—and Musharraf—through this crisis now that we have tied ourselves to him.

Please join us on December 8 for the next Forum and for the following luncheon and SCRW&M meeting.

The Political Forum, a round table discussion of current topics, sets SCRW&M apart from other Republican organizations. Everyone is encouraged to participate in the discussion and debate of current issues.

**Forum begins at 11:30am**, prior to the monthly luncheon and adjourns at 12:55 pm.

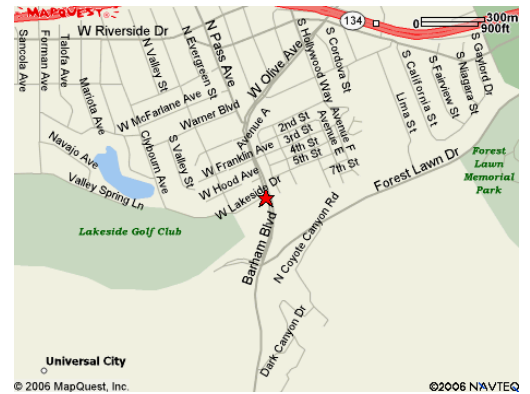

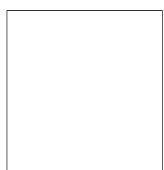
