**M**organ Brittany has been an actress for almost her entire life. She has worked with such legendary stars as Rosalind Russell, Natalie Wood, Lucille Ball, Bob Hope and Henry Fonda, to name a few. She has been directed by some of Hollywood's most prestigious directors like Alfred Hitchcock, Mervyn LeRoy, John Schlesinger, and Mark Rydell.

Although best known for her role as Katherine Wentworth, the sophisticated but maniacal sister of Pam Ewing on CBS's "Dallas," Morgan has a career that has spanned the decades. From her role as "Baby June" in the Warner Bros. Musical "Gypsy," in 1962, to "The Birds," "Marnie" and "Yours, Mine, and Ours," she has enjoyed roles with much variety.

Ms. Brittany's career began at the age of five when she appeared with Lloyd Bridges in the television series, "Sea Hunt." During the 60's she starred in over 100 television shows such as "Twilight Zone," "The Outer Limits," "Gunsmoke," "The Andy Griffith Show," "Lassie," "Playhouse 90" and "My Three Sons." In 1966 she became a member of Richard Boone's repertory company.

After attending college at California State University Northridge, Ms. Brittany performed a brief stint in Las Vegas as Gene Kelly's dancing partner in "Gene Kelly's Wonderful World of Girls".

In the 1970s, Ms. Brittany moved into feature films such as "Gable and Lombard" and "The Day of the Locust". In both films she portrayed a young Vivien Leigh, a role she repeated in the NBC mini-series "Moviola-The Scarlett O'Hara War", also starring Tony Curtis. Her many MOW credits include playing the young Mrs. Howard Hughes in "The Amazing Howard Hughes" with Tommy Lee Jones, Alice Glass, President Johnson's infamous mistress in "LBJ: The Early Years" with

## Forum Report by Eldon Quick

The Forum moderator **Michael Lerew** brought his considerable imagination and curiosity to bear as he ranged far and wide with his questions for the Forum's consideration. Of course questions about McCain and Obama were raised, but questions such as, "Have you ever been the victim of a crime, and if so, has that changed your political view?" Or, "Do you suffer from 'White Guilt'?" Or, "How much are the children of illegal immigrants effecting the education of the rest of the school population?" Took us down new paths of thought.

As General Petraeus' appearance before congress was fresh on everyone's mind, we did a quick test of opinion on **Bush's decision to keep the 140,000 troop level in Iraq.** – There was still strong support for the President's Iraq policy among the Forum attendees.

On, "**How's McCain doing?**" The Forum members are still supporting McCain, but with mixed levels of enthusiasm. As one member put it, "If you can't have steak, settle for hamburger rather than starve." We were urged to stop bad mouthing him, just keep quiet and modest.

On how much will **Obama's relationship with the Chicago minister Jeremiah Wright** hurt him; we felt it will be an issue, but primarily by word of mouth among Republican rank and file and not in the news media, and certainly not by McCain.

Since Jeremiah Wright and Obama have now injected race into the campaign we were asked, "How much is '**White Guilt**' going to be a factor, and do we personally suffer from feelings of guilt over the plight of the Blacks in our country?" Next came a biggie; a question that brought the most surprising response. "**Have you personally ever been a victim of a crime?** If so has that experience affected your social or political views.?"

Out of a group of less than 20, 2 had had guns pressed against their heads and threatened with death if they did not cooperate. They both claimed their near death experience had not affected them. They felt no different towards members of their assailants race than before. Some others admitted to being more careful after having their property stolen but there was no resentment or anger just because they had been violated. Some resentment was expressed at the deterioration of ethics and trustworthiness of people in our society. One can no longer trust advertising on radio, TV, newspapers, or magazines to hold to any standard of truth in advertising. The internet and e-mail are shark infested waters where one must question everything. This need to distrust society affects our freedom.

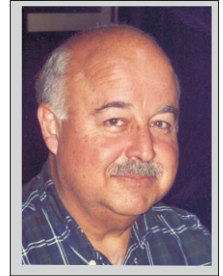

## The Good

### AB 1891 Roger Niello, R - Sacramento

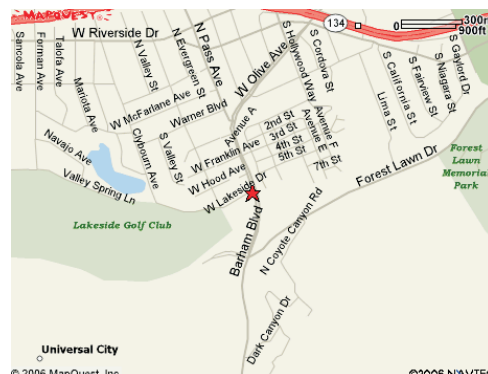
